Labour will make the UK's digital infrastructure fit for the 21st century by making broadband publicly owned, fast and free. This will be done by bring-

ing the relevant broadband parts of BT into public ownership creating two publicly owned companies British Digital Infrastructure (BDI) and the British Broadband Service (BBS). Everyone will have access to free full-fibre broadband by 2030. Unitary taxation of multinationals, including tech giants will pay for the operating

costs of the public full-fibre network. The plan will boost jobs, tackle regional inequality, and improve quality of life as part of a mission to connect communities.
