

Myth 2

Disabled people can only do simple, repetitive jobs or light duty work

FACT: This is not true. Disabled people have the same skills and capabilities for a wide range of jobs as non-disabled. Like non-

disabled, this varies from person to person. In Scotland, 125,000 disabled people of working age hold a degree level qualification or above.

Yet, disabled people with a degree are less likely to be employed than nondisabled without one. (Scottish Government, 2018)
