

Last chance to fix Scotland's climate law

On Wednesday MSPs have the chance to deliver a Climate Act fit for the climate emergency. Campaigners, including Stop Climate Chaos Scotland, will be outside the Scottish Parliament at lunchtime before the debate to remind politicians what is at stake – our planet, our future – as highlighted on Friday by the millions around the world showing their support for the school climate strikers in global #climatestrike actions. You can mail MSPs asap to demand a stronger 2030 target, improved action on Just Transition etc., then listen outside the Parliament on Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday morning to readings from the IPCC Special Report on Global Warming of 1.5C, join the lunchtime demo, and watch the debate live streamed. UNISON welcomes public inquiry into sick kids hospitals

The failings at The Royal Hospital for Young People in Edinburgh, and the QUEH in Glasgow are now well known. UNISON has been highlighting these issues for a long time and <u>welcomed the announcement</u> of the Inquiry.

Commenting Thomas Waterson, Chair of UNISON's Health Committee said "The whole fiasco yet again highlights the weakness of the Scottish Government's private finance system: The Scottish Futures Trust. Patients, staff and tax payers should not be left paying the price for this catalogue of errors and it is vital this inquiry ensures this is never allowed to happen again."

Higher Education Strike BallotUNISON is asking its members in higher education to vote 'yes' for strike action in a pay ballot that opens on Monday 9 September.

The union believes the employer's pay offer just isn't good enough. Most staff would see a pay increase of just 1.8% – well below inflation.

Lyn Marie O'Hara of UNISON City of Glasgow has won the TUC Organising Award for the work done by her and her sisters in the branch organising the Equal Pay strike. See the TUC video here.

8,500 Glasgow City workers, predominantly low paid women, took part in the Glasgow Women's Strike on 23 and 24 October last year demanding equal pay – and won.

The victory followed 11 years of campaigning with 14 disputes.
