Save from harm - UNISON Scotland survey of social work teams



Our new report looks at issues facing our members working in social work teams in Scottish local authorities.

- 76% of respondents stated their teams did not have enough staff
- 82% stated their workload had got heavier in the last few years
- 89% of staff are working late and skipping skipping breaks to keep on top of their workload
- Two thirds of staff had experienced physical or verbal abuse at work
- 90% of respondents are considering leaving their jobs in social work.

Universal Credit

The ineptitude of the introducton of universal credit has been matched only by the cruelty it has visited on the poor. The five week wait for a first payment doesn't so much 'mimic the world of work' as send people to foodbanks.

As if this wasn't enough, the viciousness of the system is compounded by the abhorrent benefit sanctions regime. People have died as a direct result of benefits sanctions or errors – in many cases, ending their own lives in utter desperation.
