


Policy Briefing 109: Local Government Financial Overview

Audit Scotland published a <u>financial overview</u> of local government finance at the end of 2019. This report gives both an overview of the picture across Scotland and detail on the challenges individual councils face.

KEY POINTS: • Local authority funding has been cut substantially. Councils have been using reserves, increasing charges and more recently increasing council tax in response to the cuts. Councils have identified a "funding gap" of £0.5bn for 2019/20.

WINTER FUEL GRANT

Members living on a low income constantly struggle to make ends meet – and this can be particularly acute in the winter when the cost of heating homes rises as the outside temperature falls.

But it's not all bad news – help IS available. The union's welfare charity <u>There for You</u> has once more set up a limited fund to help members on low incomes towards the cost of their winter fuel bill through a one-off payment of £40. <u>Details are here</u>.



Our Response to the Scottish Government's Consultation on Prohibiting Smoking Outside Hospital Buildings

UNISON generally welcomes the principle of introducing new measures to end the practice of smoking on hospital grounds. We agree that the current smoke free policies have had some impact but have not been sufficient to end the practice of smoking around hospital buildings. There is still a highly visible smoking presence particularly round doorways.
