Stage 3 Proceedings: Budget (Scotland) (No.4) Bill

We are as happy as anyone that Kate Forbes assertion that "In allocating those resources, we have used every fiscal lever that we have to the fullest extent. Every penny is accounted for " has turned out not to be true and that she has found £173m down the back of the settee sorry, available via revised forecasts, assumptions and reprofiling. This still **doesn't make it a good budget** - merely a less bad one.

Local Authorities are making cuts and budgets for other services are inadequate (see the policing article below). Meanwhile the Scottish Government are boasting that Scottish tax payers and businesses are paying less tax than elsewhere in the UK. This at a point of both desperate need and it seems a willingness on the part of the public to **pay more tax to fund services**



UNISON Submission to Policing Sub Cttee capital resourcing inquiry (Post Budget)

After police stations began to **literally fall apart** last year, Holyrood's Justice Committee began an inquiry into capital spending in Police Scotland. This was part of their pre budget scrutiny of the Scottish Government. They published **their conclusions** in November, the Scottish Government promised to respond soon after the budget. The response came in the form of a **four page letter** from the Cabinet Secretary that really didn't add much to what was known – or offer any significant improvement to the current woefully inadequate situation. The Sub Cttee asked for our comments on the response. We've given them...

UNISON Scotland response on "Housing to 2040"

To achieve a target of 35,000 new social homes, Scottish Government spending on housing increased during 2016-21. However, the consultation on housing strategy to 2040 makes clear that this level of public funding will NOT continue after 2021. UNISON's response argues for social homes to be the priority. The government's powers over taxation should be used to maintain the level of social house-building and public sector pension funds should be used as an additional source of housing investment.



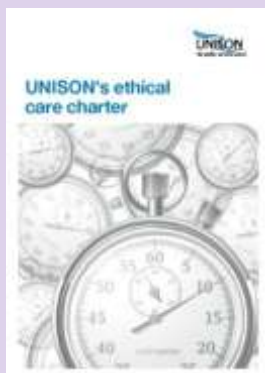
