Net Zero

The Scottish Government have set a target for Scotland to be a net zero carbon emmiting nation by 2045. This is certainly better than saying that Scotland will still be a net emitter of carbon by 2045 but there is considerable doubt as to whether it is good enough. UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres warned last week that the world is on a "catastrophic pathway" to 2.7°C of global heating. Governments are failing us on achieving the Paris Agreement 1.5°C target. The science shows a 'code red warning for humanity'.Yet Scotland failed to meet its last three annual climate targets

Stop Climate Chaos Scotland has **<u>called for</u>** urgent updates to Scotland's Climate Change Plan. Progress will be measured by how fast emissions fall, not by ambitious long-term promises. Public services must be funded to lead by example. <u>SCCS</u> <u>demands</u> for COP26 in Glasgow include the importance of a Just Transition to ensure that no workers or communities are left behind. Plans must be strengthened, particularly to support <u>green jobs</u>, not offshoring, and in the face of Scottish Government claims to be implementing the recommendations of the Just Transition Commission, yet <u>abandoning</u> <u>plans</u> for a publicly owned energy company. The Commission said this should be established "at pace with a broad remit".

UNISON Scotland wants an industrial strategy that includes greatly **increased public ownership in energy** and transport. We need to invest in a public programme of retrofitting of houses and an integrated sustainable public transport system that serves all communities instead of **rip-off bus** and **rail fares**, with **reduced services**. It is vital to get the **Just Transition right** and work for climate justice worldwide.

UNISON members at Dundee University set for strike action to defend pensions

UNISON members at Dundee University who are part of, or are eligible to be part of, the university's superannuation scheme are taking strike action later this month over the employer's plans to close and replace the defined benefit CARE scheme with a defined contribution scheme next year.

Affecting around 900 staff on grades one to six, the proposals are set to leave many members in pension poverty and will see some losing up to 40% of their pension. Those on grades higher than six fall under a different, nationally negotiated, scheme. Action is initially planned, with 300 members striking, for five days across the start of the new academic year, with pickets each morning as well a rally in Dundee's City Square at noon on the first day, 29 September. Scottish Government – Programme for Government 2021-22

The Programme for Government for 2021-22 has been announced. This sets out the Scottish Government's legislative programme and other administrative actions for this parliamentary year. This briefing highlights the issues likely to have the greatest impact on UNISON members.

The most pressing priority is recovery from COVID. A Recovery Strategy and a Recovery Bill focused on the hardest hit will be produced in the first year of Parliament. The promised COVID recovery strategy will "outline a shared vision with local government."
