#### **Local Government Strike**

The Joint Trade unions in Local Government submitted their pay claim more than 10 months ago. That claim was made 19 months into a global pandemic which has seen them working flat delivering services that everyone has relied on. Local Government staff are essential workers and as deserving of decency and fairness in their pay settlement as anyone else. That hasn't been forthcoming.

The Joint Trade Unions have between them mandates to take action in half of Scotland's local authority areas. and have notified COSLA that industrial action notices to those authorities that they will be calling out members in school cleaning, school catering, school janitorial, waste, recycling and fleet maintenance services on the 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th November.

UNISON, and the other other Local Government Trade Unions, are calling for the Cabinet Secretaries for Finance, Local Government and Education to intervene. it is not credible for the Scottish Government to shrug their shoulders and say 'not me guv' when it is they who determine how much money councils get and tell them how to spend much of it.
